From my Heart:

The other day I took two visiting children to our community pool. The little 5 year old told me he could not swim. We don't want to get in a place where we can't touch the bottom. Jesus will hold us up in the hard times if we put our trust in Him. Kenya orphanage update:

As of late June, approximately seven months after the original target installation date, Haven on the Hill children's home **HAS ELECTRICITY!!** Because this is the first site in the community to receive electrical service, many obstacles had to be overcome. Many visits to the site by several teams had to be accomplished before the service could be connected. In a common occurrence in Kenya before the service is connected, thieves tried to steal the transformer which belongs to the electric company and resides on our site. But our Lord protected the expensive piece of equipment through our night watchman who saw it happening and sounded an alarm (blew a whistle), which brought the men of the community out, and the thieves scattered.

Now that we have electricity, the water pump can be placed in the borehole (water well) and roof to the pump house can be installed for security. This brings us a vital step closer to being able to supply clean water to the children and staff and to allow the community to come and get clean drinking water. The final piece will be to connect the water

tank and plumbing.

Our children, Kelvin, Joshua, Godfrey and James, are attending Sunday school and growing in the Lord. We regularly let the other children in the community come in and play games.

Jackie, our first live-in missionary arrived at Haven on the Hill from the USA in June. Her plans are to help out with the children teaching them English and giving them a lot of love. Jackie plans on staying for three months. *Phil & Janice*

Back to Kenya

On July 13th, Janice will be returning to Kenya with Laura, our long time friend. Our intent is to bring two more boys home to Haven on the Hill! Janice will also meet with a medical doctor from Texas who will be visiting our site for the first time to check out our boys. We also plan on building a playground for the children. We are very excited about all three prospects.

Future plans

Now that the clean water work is almost complete we will be focusing on **construction of our next building**, **the Director's home** which will be used as a girl's home as well as a place for visiting missionary groups from the USA, **This building will allow us to take in at least four times more children than the six that we currently have room for.** Our vision is to eventually provide a home for 100 children while giving them as close to a normal home environment as feasible. Pray for wisdom in moving forward.

We want to set up various ministries such as vacation Bible school, public showing of Christian videos, a Christian library and other ways to grow God's kingdom. As always we want to continue giving out Bibles whenever we go to Kenya. *Phil & Janice*
