Non-school nights at Haven are filled with singing and praising! The boys love to play the drums and shakers and to dance unto our Lord and **the joy of the Lord is in that place!**

I got to spend some time with Kevin Kelly, our newest fam-

ily member. He had been living a meager life with his father. One day his disapfather peared. Days later, neighbors discovered Kevin in his house alone and hungry. He was sent to the Nai-Rescue
